INCIDENT REPORTING

What Qualifies as an 'Incident'?

- Any injury causing broken skin, bruising, lumps, or biting
- Fighting or aggressive behavior leading to a child's removal.
- Any inappropriate or concerning interactions (between PALs, children, staff, or parents).
- Any inappropriate or concerning behavior between children.
- When in doubt, give us a shout!

How to Report an Incident:

- Inform on-site shelter staff immediately.
- Email your Horizons Playspace Specialist and Shelter Liaison within 24 hours.

PREVENTING INCIDENTS

Falls, bumps, and scrapes are a natural part of childhood, but we can take steps to minimize them in the Playspace.

- At the start of each shift, check for choking hazards, trash, and broken toys or equipment.
 - Use the choke tube in your cleaning kit to test small items (see page 3 for instructions).
 - Discard any unsafe items.
- Report hazards to shelter and Horizons staff for necessary changes.

RESPONDING TO AN INCIDENT

- Comfort the injured child through reassurance (e.g., "You bumped your head. That was scary, but I'm here with you.").
- Assess if medical care is needed. If so, call the front desk for staff support.
 - Note: PALs are not responsible for medical/first aid care.
- If no immediate care is needed, continue the shift but inform shelter staff before leaving so they can notify the parents.
 - Ask staff for translation assistance if needed.
- **Support other children** by acknowledging their concerns and preventing crowding so the injured child receives one-on-one attention.
